

Outlines of Ephesians

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June 2004

What an amazing family God has made us. His wonderful creative diversity shines through the human race. We are all fearfully and wonderfully made in His image; but we are all so different. We are tall and short, large and small, young and old – representing every tribe and race – so different, yet fundamentally the same. Beneath the diverse hues of our skin is a skeleton, God's girders to lift us up.

This is a book of 'skeletons,' essential support for living messages from God's Word – Paul's letter to the Ephesians in particular. In almost thirty years of teaching and preaching in America, Uganda, and now Central Asia I have found Ephesians to be very beneficial to God's people. Developing these outlines was an essential first step for me to formulate my messages, and I share them to encourage you in ministry. There is more than one way to correctly outline a text. In fact, I present more than one outline for the same passage sometimes. These bare outlines wait for your creative breath, as God's Spirit fills you. Our messages for God will be as diverse and unique as He has made us all. I am grateful to many commentators especially John Stott, James Boice, Warren Wiersbe, and John Calvin who have shaped my thoughts.

What should you do with these outlines? Their purpose is to help you better understand Paul's message to the Ephesians, so that you might more effectively share with others. I pray they

will point you to Him and His Word. If they are helpful, use them in your ministry. Carefully consider the most effective way to share with your listeners; alter and adapt these outlines as you think appropriate. As the best commentary on Scripture is Scripture, I provide a number of cross-references, more than would typically be shared in one message.

We must take care in how we actually refer to cross-references when we speak. Often a speaker will ask listeners to look up the references in their own Bibles. Be careful here. The goal is to understand Ephesians, not to bounce through the Bible like a ping-pong ball! Every time you turn to a passage of Scripture you lose a certain percentage of your listeners. We all know that many people come to church without a Bible – shame on them! Some who do bring their Bibles do not know how to find what is inside. When you excitedly tell the church to turn and look at a wonderful verse from Zephaniah, you will hear the pages of many Bibles turning, and turning, and turning, and turning. Long after you actually read the text, some people still turn pages trying to find the place. Then when you go from Zephaniah to Leviticus over to Philemon and climax with a great verse from Ezra, you will hear a lot of pages turning! Soon people will get tired of turning -- even tired of listening.

Generally, it is best not to ask listeners to turn away from your teaching/preaching text. If they have found it and are following with you - keep going! I have two criteria for asking people to turn to a cross-reference; 1) the reference is essential to establish an extremely important point, and 2) the cross-referenced passage is long or complex. Some extremely

important points can be clearly understood without looking up the text. You can say, “God is love” – an amazingly profound truth – without forcing the congregation to turn in their Bibles to 1 John 4.8, for example.

Nevertheless, I do use other passages to explain and apply my teaching/preaching text. Most of the time I write out the entire reference verse in my notes. Sometimes I can recite the verse from memory. Occasionally I have prepared listeners in advance with note cards of the Scripture references and ask them to be ready to read a passage. I do not always read the entire verse, usually just the key phrase that speaks to my point. Occasionally, I cite the exact reference of a passage - especially when the hearers should note the passage to look up later. But most of the time I do not cite the exact references. It can become quite tiring to listen to a speaker cite a long list of numbers, “chapter 7, verse 8, chapter 12, verse 2, chapter 9, verse 36...no wait, that is not verse 36, it is verse 37, no it is verse 38...” You understand my point. The same Bible that brings light in our preaching can hinder our understanding if we do not use it carefully. There are many distractions that steal away the attention of your listeners; do not make your own use of the Bible one of those thieves.

These outlines are certainly not perfect or inspired, only Scripture itself can rightly make that claim. But if they help you to understand Holy Scripture, and more faithfully share Him with others, they will have served their “hidden” purpose.

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Ephesians 1.3

"Jesus is All"

1. God Gives Us All Good Gifts

a. Father: "Praise be to the God and Father"

The Father is the subject throughout verses 3 to 14.

3.14,15 "For this reason I kneel before the Father, from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name."

James 1.17 "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father"

b. Son: "our Lord Jesus Christ"

i. His Humanity - "the God of Jesus Christ"

As a man, Jesus related to God the Father as His God

Luke 23.34 Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."

Hebrews 10.5,7 "when Christ came into the world, he said: ... Here I am--it is written about me in the scroll-- I have come to do your will, O God."

Real Man who died a Real Death

5.25 "just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her"

Matthew 1.1 "Jesus Christ the son of David, the son of Abraham"

2 John 7 "Many deceivers, who do not acknowledge Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh, have gone out into the world. Any such person is the deceiver and the antichrist."

ii. His Deity - "the Father of Jesus Christ"

John 3.16, 1.18, 10.30 Unique, Eternal Son: "one and only Son"

Psalm 2.7 "He said to me, 'You are my Son; today I have become your Father.'"

John 13.32 “God will glorify the Son in himself”

c. Holy Spirit: “every spiritual blessing”

1.13,14 “the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance”

1.17 “the Spirit of wisdom and revelation”

2. The Gifts God Gives

Temple of Diana in Ephesus was the Central Bank of Asia Minor, all the riches of people in the area came from there. Paul reveals all blessings to us come from God’s riches in Christ.

a. Their Nature: "every spiritual blessing"

Paul asked disciples of John the Baptist in Ephesus:
Acts 19.2 "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?"

Romans 8.9 "if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ"

i. Common Grace: God’s gifts to all humanity

Matthew 5.45 “He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous.”

ii. Saving Grace: Blessings uniquely for believers in Jesus

1.1 “saints in Ephesus, the faithful in Christ Jesus”

1.4 “he chose us in him”

1.5 “adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ”

1.7 “In Him we have redemption through his blood”

1.13 “And you also were sealed in Christ”

2.5 “God made us alive with Christ”

b. Their Location: "in the heavenly realms"

Earthly Blessings are evidences of Common Grace. Many unbelievers have better ‘things’ on earth.

Psalms 103.2-5 “Praise the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits--who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's.”

Paul prays for us to see ‘into the heavenlies’:

1.17,18 “I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray also that

the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints”

"the heavenlies" Definition - "Unseen world of spiritual realities, where Jesus reigns, and His people reign with Him, not a geographical or spatial reference."
- phrase used five times in Bible, all by Paul in Ephesians

3. Jesus' is God's Gift Giver

a. Exclusive: “every spiritual blessing *in Christ*”

Only Jesus makes God known to the World

1.22 “God placed all things under his feet”

2.12 “you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world.”

2.18 “For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.”

Acts 4.12 “Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.”

John 14.6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Matthew 11.27 "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

b. Exhaustive “*every* spiritual blessing in Christ”

We will never find more of God than what Jesus reveals.

1.21 “far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every title”

1.23 “the fullness of him who fills everything in every way”

3.8 “the unsearchable riches of Christ”

Colossians 1.19 “For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in Him”

Colossians 2.9,10 “For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form”

John 14.8-10 Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us." Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father' Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me?"

4. Are you in Christ, God's Gift Giver?

Two meanings of being "in Christ" in Scripture -

a. Federal: what Jesus does for us as our Representative

1.5 "he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ"

1.11 "In him we were also chosen"

2.13 "now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ"

Romans 5.18 "the result of one trespass (*Adam in Eden*) was condemnation for all men, so also the result of one act of righteousness (*Second Adam on Cross*) was justification that brings life for all men."

b. Experiential: what Jesus does in us

1.18 "I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know"

3.16-19 "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this

love that surpasses knowledge--that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

Colossians 1.27 "Christ in you the hope of glory."

Galatians 1.16 "God revealed his Son in me"

Romans 8.10 "But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness."

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Ephesians 1.3-14 "Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost"

1. The Father, Architect of Salvation (vs. 3 - 6)

a. Blessed by the Triune God

v. 3 "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ."

John 16.15 "All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will take what is mine and make it known to you"

b. Chosen to be Holy

v. 4 "he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight"

v. 11 "In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will"

1 John 4.19 "We love because, he first loved us"

John 1.12,13 "to all who received Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become the children of God - children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision... but born of God"

c. Adopted as God's Children

v. 5 "he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ"

Galatians 4.6,7 "we have received the full rights of sons. Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, Abba, Father. So you are no longer a slave, but a son"

v. 5 "in accordance with the pleasure of His will"

Romans 9.15 "I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion"

John 15.16 "You did not choose me, but I chose you to go and bear fruit - fruit that will last."

d. Our Confession

v. 6 "to the praise of His glorious grace"

Matthew 11.25-27 Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure. All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him."

2. The Son, Accomplished Salvation (vs. 7 - 12)

All of God's Blessings to Us are: "IN CHRIST"

Galatians 2.20 "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

a. Redeemed by His Blood

v. 7 "In Him we have redemption, through His blood"

Mark 10.45 "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

b. Forgiven by His Grace

vs. 7, 8 “the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding”

2 Corinthians 5.21 "God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God"

c. Head over Heaven and Earth

vs. 9-11 “...to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ...”

Colossians 1.16 “all things were created by Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together”

Romans 11.36 "For from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be the glory forever."

d. Our Confidence

v. 12 "for the praise of His glory"

Romans 8.28 “God works all things together for the good of them that love God and are called according to His purpose”

3. The Holy Spirit, Applies Salvation (vs. 13 - 14)

a. The Promise Fulfilled

v. 13 “you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit”

Joel 2.28 "I will pour out My Spirit on all people"

John 16.14 "He will take what is mine and declare it unto you"

Acts 2.38,39 "Repent and be baptized...And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you...”

b. Hearing and Believing

v. 13 “you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked”

John 6.37,44 "All that the Father gives me will come to me....No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws Him"

Romans 10.14,17 "How can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?...Therefore, faith comes by hearing the message, and the message is heard through the Word of Christ"

c. Marked with a Seal

v. 13 “you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit”

4.30 “the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption”

Romans 8.16 "The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children"

d. Down-payment Guarantee

v. 14 “a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession”

Romans 8.23 “we ourselves, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies”

Matthew 19.28 “at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man sits on his glorious throne”

e. Our Celebration

v. 14 "to the praise of His glory"

Luke 10.21 “Jesus, full of joy through the Holy Spirit, said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth”

Acts 7.55 “Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God.”

2 Corinthians 3.18 “And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.”

Philippians 3.3 “we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus”

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Ephesians 1.4-6

"God's Election"

1. Basis of Election

a. God's Initiative

v. 4 "before the creation of the world"

John 6.37,44 “All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away... No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him”

John 15.16 "You did not choose me, but I chose you to go and bear fruit - fruit that will last."

Romans 9.10-13 “Rebekah's children had one and the same father, our father Isaac. Yet, before the twins were born or had done anything good or bad--in order that God's purpose in election might stand: not by works but by him who calls--she was told, "The older will serve the younger." Just as it is written: "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated."

b. God's Love

v. 5 “in love he predestined us”

1 John 4.19 "We love because, he first loved us"

Matthew 12.18 "Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight”

1 Thessalonians 1.4 “we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you”

2 Thessalonians 2.13 “But we ought always to thank God for you, brothers loved by the Lord, because from the beginning God chose you to be saved through the sanctifying work of the Spirit and through belief in the truth.”

Colossians 3.12 “God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved”

c. God's Glory

v. 6 "to the praise of his glorious grace"

Matthew 11.25-27 Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure. All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.”

Romans 11.36 “For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever! Amen.”

2. Basic Objections to Election

a. Foreknowledge?

Romans 8.29 “For those God foreknew he also predestined”

Common Misinterpretation: First we choose God; then when He sees what we have decided, He chooses us.

But we are spiritually unable to choose God:

2.1 “you were dead in your transgressions and sins”

Correct Interpretation: “Foreknowledge” is God’s initiating love, He first loves us!

Isaiah 37.26 "Have you not heard? Long ago I ordained it. In days of old I planned it; now I have brought it to pass”

Amos 3:2 "You only have I chosen (lit. 'known') of all the families of the earth"

b. Big Picture Only?

Some acknowledge God's Sovereignty in the "Big Details" of life, but say that He has left the smaller things, like our spiritual decisions, up to us. But God is concerned for big and small, everything!

Isaiah 46.10,11 "I make known the end from the beginning, from ancient times, what is still to come. I say: My purpose will stand, and I will do all that I please. From the east I summon a bird of prey; from a far-off land, a man to fulfill my purpose. What I have said, that will I bring about; what I have planned, that will I do."

Matthew 6.26 "Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?"

Luke 21.18 "But not a hair of your head will perish."

Romans 8.28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

c. Arbitrary?

Some say that for God to choose some is arbitrary; the choice has no meaningful basis. How could God do that? But everything God does is perfect and purposeful.

1 Corinthians 14.33 "For God is not a God of disorder but of peace."

Job 36.5 "God is mighty, but does not despise men; he is mighty, and firm in his purpose."

Psalms 33.11 "the plans of the LORD stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations"

Psalms 40.5 "Many, O LORD my God, are the wonders you have done. The things you planned for us no one can recount to you; were I to speak and tell of them, they would be too many to declare."

Proverbs 19.21 "Many are the plans in a man's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails."

Isaiah 14.24 "The LORD Almighty has sworn, "Surely, as I have planned, so it will be, and as I have purposed, so it will stand."

d. "All" or "World" Passages?

From Abraham to Jesus "salvation is from the Jews" (John 4.22). Beginning at Pentecost, salvation was extended to "all," the "whole world."

Acts 2.17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people."

1 John 2.2 "He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world."

1 Timothy 4.10 "we have put our hope in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, and especially of those who believe"

2 Corinthians 5.14,15 "we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again."

Interpretation: These Scriptures are not referring to every single individual in every nation. Rather, salvation is for those God has called from all nations throughout the whole world.

e. Unjust?

Some accuse God of being unjust in choosing only some for salvation. But if God gave us justice, none would be saved; all are guilty. Election is based on grace and mercy, not justice.

2.4,5 "because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions"

Genesis 18.25 "Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?"

Ezekiel 18.32 "For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign LORD. Repent and live!"

2 Peter 3.9 "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

3. Blessings of Election

a. Humility

1.5,6 "in accordance with his pleasure and will--to the praise of his glorious grace"

2.8,9 "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith--and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God -- not by works, so that no one can boast."

b. Adoration

v. 3 "Praise be to God"

v. 6 "to the praise of his glorious grace"

v. 12 "for the praise of his glory"

v. 14 "to the praise of his glory"

1 John 3.1 “How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!”

c. Holiness

v. 4 “to be holy and blameless in his sight”

1 Peter 1.1,2 “To God's elect, strangers in the world...who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and sprinkling by his blood”

Romans 8.29 “For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son”

d. Assurance

Titus 3.5 “he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy”

John 10.27-29 “My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand.”

e. Evangelism

John 10.16 “I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd.”

Acts 18.9-11 “One night the Lord spoke to Paul in a vision: “Do not be afraid; keep on speaking, do not be silent. For I am with you, and no one is going to attack and harm you, because I have many people in this city.” So Paul stayed for a year and a half, teaching them the word of God.”

Acts 16.14 “Lydia...The Lord opened her heart to respond to Paul's message.”

Acts 13.48 “When the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and honored the word of the Lord; and all who were appointed for eternal life believed.”

Isaiah 55.11 “so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it”

Romans 1.16 “I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes”

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Ephesians 1.7-10

“Set Free in Jesus”

Work of God in the Past: Predestination, Redemption

Work of God in the Present: Adoption, Gift of Holy Spirit

Work of God in Future: All things placed under Headship of Christ

1. Redemption from Sin

a. Set free in Jesus

v. 7 “In him we have redemption through his blood”

Redemption: “to be set free through the payment of a price”

Ruth 4.14 "Praise be to the LORD, who this day has not left you without a kinsman-redeemer. May he become famous throughout Israel!"

Mark 10.45 “For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.”

Romans 3.24 “justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus”

John 8.36 “So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.”

b. Forgiveness of Sin

v. 7 “the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace”

Mark 2.10 “the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins”

Luke 24.47 “repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations”

Acts 5.31 “God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel.”

c. through blood

v. 7 “redemption through his blood”

Matthew 26.28 “This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.”

Acts 20.28 “Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood.”

Hebrews 9.12 “he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, having obtained eternal redemption”

1 Peter 1.18,19 For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life handed down to you from your forefathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.”

2. Revelation of Salvation

a. In Christ we Know God's Plan

v. 9 "he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ"

v. 11 "according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will"

1.18 "I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you"

2.14 "he himself is our peace"

3.4 "the mystery of Christ"

b. Christ is God's Plan

v. 10 "to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ"

1.22 "God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church"

Matthew 28.18 "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me"

Colossians 2.13-15 "When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your sinful nature, God made you alive

with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having canceled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross."

Hebrews 3.6 "Christ is faithful as a son over God's house"

Revelation 5.12 "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise!"

3. Restoration of Society

a. We are Made Sons and Daughters of God

1.5 "he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ"

2.19 "members of God's household"

Galatians 4.5 "that we might receive the full rights of sons"

Matthew 19.28 Jesus said to them, "I tell you the truth, at the renewal of all things, when the Son of Man sits on his glorious throne, you who have followed me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.”

3. How Do We Get this New Life?

a. Salvation: a Cry of Helplessness

Matthew 26.39 “he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, “My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will.”

1 Samuel 16.7 “The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.”

c. People

1. God is Able

Those who make them will be like them, and so will all who trust in them.”

Isaiah 41.22-24 "Bring in your idols to tell us what is going to happen. Tell us what the former things were, so that we may consider them and know their final outcome. Or declare to us the things to come, tell us what the future holds, so we may know that you are gods. Do something, whether good or bad, so that we will be dismayed and filled with fear. But you are less than nothing and your works are utterly worthless; he who chooses you is detestable.”

b. He is Abundant

v. 20 “immeasurably more than we ask or imagine”

Jeremiah 32.17 "Ah, Sovereign LORD, you have made the heavens and the earth by your great power and outstretched arm. Nothing is too hard for you.”

2. God is in Us

a. Power

c. Consummation

The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their splendor into it. On no day will its gates ever be shut, for there will be no night there. The glory and honor of the nations will be brought into it.”

v. 3 “Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.”

2.14 “For he himself is our peace, who has made the two one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility”

g. Purpose

v. 4 “called to one hope”

Romans 15.13 “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.”

c. Commitment

v. 20 "you, however, did not come to know Christ that way"

4.25 "each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor"

4.28 "He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need."

4.29 "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen."

Romans 13.14 "clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the sinful nature"

1.9,10 “he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment--to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ.”

Romans 1.1-4 “the gospel of God...regarding his Son, who as to his human nature was a descendant of David, and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord.”

b. Power

1.19,20 “his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of his mighty strength, which he exerted in Christ when he raised him from the dead”

Acts 2.24 “God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him.”

c. Judgment

6.9 “masters...slaves... know that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven”

Acts 17.31 “For he has set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead.”

2. The Demands of His Resurrection

4.24 “put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness”

John 11.43,44 Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."

a. Stop Falsehood, Speak Truth

vs. 25 “put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor”

4.21 “the truth that is in Jesus”

Colossians 3.9,10 “Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator.”

b. Resist the Devil, Control your Anger

vs. 26,27 "In your anger do not sin" : Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold.”

v. 31 “Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice.”

James 1.19,20 “My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires.”

c. Stop Stealing, Work and Give

v. 28 “He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need.”

Acts 20.35 “In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: `It is more blessed to give than to receive.'”

d. Don't Tear Down, Build Up

v. 29 “Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.”

Proverbs 12.18 “Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.”

Matthew 12.36 “I tell you that men will have to give account on the day of judgment for every careless word they have spoken.”

e. Forgive, Because we Cannot Forget

v. 32 “Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.”

2 Corinthians 5.15 “He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again.”

f. Not in our Strength, But His

v. 31 “And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.”

2.5,10 “God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions--it is by grace you have been saved....For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.”

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Ephesians 5.1-7 “A New Commandment and New Calling”

1. New Commandment, results in:

a. New Liberty

5.1 “therefore”

4.31 “Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice”

5.4 No “obscenity, foolish talk, coarse joking”

Colossians 3.8,9 “now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other”

Exodus 23.13 “Be careful to do everything I have said to you. Do not invoke the names of other gods; do not let them be heard on your lips.”

d. New Loyalty

5.7 “Therefore do not be partners with them”

James 4.4 “Anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God.”

2. New Calling

a. to be God’s Child

5.1 “dearly loved children” -

1.5 “he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ”

1 John 3.1 “How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!”

b. Heirs of the Kingdom

5.5 “For of this you can be sure...inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.”

Romans 8.17 “Now if we are children, then we are heirs--heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ”

Colossians 1.13 “For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves”

Revelation 1.5,6 “To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood, and has made us to be a kingdom and priests to serve his God and Father”

c. Guaranteed by God’s Word

5.6 “Let no one deceive you with empty words”

2 Peter 1.4 “he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires”

d. Redeemed by His Blood

5.2 “Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God”

John 3.16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

Galatians 2.20 “The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me.”

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Ephesians 5.1-7

"Be Like God"

v. 1 "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children"

God has qualities unique to Himself, for example He alone is:

- 1) Self Existent - God has no origins, is answerable to no one
- 2) Self Sufficient - God has no needs and depends on no one
- 3) Eternal - God has always existed and will always exist
- 4) Omnipotent- God is all powerful, nothing He cannot do
- 5) Omnipresent - God is always everywhere at once
- 6) Omniscient - God knows all, nothing hidden from Him

But God has qualities that we share in limited ways. Paul asks us to be like God in these ways:

1. God is Love

1 John 4.8 “Whoever does not love does not know God, because *God is love.*”

a. the Father

v. 1 "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children"

1.4,5 "In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ"

1 John 3.1 "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God!"

b. the Son

v. 2 "Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God"

3.18,19 "to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge"

1 John 3.16 "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers."

Galatians 2.20 "I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

John 15.13 "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends."

c. In His Family

v. 2 "live a life of love, just as Christ loved"

4.32 "forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you"

1 Corinthians 11.1 "Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ."

2 Corinthians 3.2 "You yourselves are our letter...known and read by everybody"

2. God is Light

1 John 1.5 *God is light*; in him there is no darkness at all.

a. Holy Walk

v. 3 But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people.

Habakkuk 1.12,13 "Your eyes are too pure to look on evil; you cannot tolerate wrong."

b. Holy Talk

v. 4 "Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place"

v. 3 "not even a hint"

Colossians 3.16 “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God”

c. Holy Heart

b. Continues by Constant Filling with the Spirit

Acts 2.4,13 "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them... Some, however, made fun of them and said, They have had too much wine."

"The comparison between wine and the Spirit does not suggest that the Spirit is a sort of fluid with which one may be filled, any more than the connecting of baptism in water with baptism in the Spirit suggests the Spirit is a sort of fluid in which one may be dipped! No! He operates as a person." F.F. Bruce

1) Believer under the influence of Holy Spirit, unlike alcohol, knows what they are doing.

2 Timothy 1.7 "For God did not give us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-discipline."

2) Alcohol is Depressant; Spirit is Stimulant for Good

3) Drunkenness Dehumanizes; Spirit makes us more fully human - more like Jesus

4) Drunkenness is Wasteful of money, time, lives, families, community; "debauchery" = wastefulness. The Spirit fills believer with purpose, God's riches, love, and fruitfulness.

2. Evidence of the Spirit

Submission does NOT mean subjection, subordination, or subjugation

2) In God we are not identical

1 Corinthians 11.3 “Now I want you to realize that the head of every man is Christ, and the head of the woman is man, and the head of Christ is God.

Submission means that the husband is the leader

v. 23 “For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior.”

b. In Everything

v. 24 “wives should submit to their husbands in everything”

5.21 Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

wives / husbands - children / parents - slaves / masters

6.9 “he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is no favoritism with him.”

2. Why Must She Do It?

a. Creation: the way God made the world

1 Corinthians 11.7-9 “the woman is the glory of man. For man did not come from woman, but woman from man; neither was man created for woman, but woman for man.”

1 Timothy 2.11-15 “A woman should learn in quietness and full submission...For Adam was formed first, then Eve. And Adam was not the one deceived; it was the woman who was deceived and became a sinner.”

b. Fall: perfect harmony between man and woman lost

2 Corinthians 11.3 “Eve was deceived by the serpent's cunning”

Examples:

Incarnation and Creation: Jesus did not become a man to be like us, man was created in the image of how Jesus would ultimately become incarnate.

Marriage and Salvation: Man is given marriage as a picture of the relationship between Christ and the Church.

1. Profound Mystery

a. God the Husband

Isaiah 54.5 “For your Maker is your husband-- the LORD Almighty is His name”

Hosea 2.19 “I will betroth you to me forever; I will betroth you in righteousness and justice, in love and compassion.”

Mark 2.19 JESUS: “the bridegroom was with them”

Jeremiah 31.33 "This is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel...I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people."

b. Believing Bride

Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and she brought her to the man. The man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman,' for he was taken out of man." For this reason a man will leave his father and

mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh. The man and his wife were both naked, and they felt no shame”

Matthew 19.3-6 “Haven't you read," (Jesus) replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate."

b. Purpose: Relationship with God

2 Corinthians 6.14 “Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness?”

Hebrews 13.4 “Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral.”

- Early Christians were politically, economically, and socially insignificant
- Christian faith was illegal in Roman Empire

1 Corinthians 5.9,10 “I have written you in my letter not to associate with sexually immoral people--not at all meaning the people of this world who are immoral...In that case you would have to leave this world”

John 14.6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

2 Corinthians 10.4,5 "The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

c. Jesus' Everlasting Salvation

6.10-12 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes.

John 12.31-33 "Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die"

Luke 10.17 The seventy-two returned with joy and said, "Lord, even the demons submit to us in your name." Jesus replied, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. I have given you authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy; nothing will harm you."

Romans 16:20 The God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet. The grace of our Lord Jesus be with you.

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Ephesians 6.10-13

"Know Your Enemy"

Paul has taught the Ephesians about Jesus' Spiritual Victory:

1.20, 21 “he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority, power and dominion”

2.2 “the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient”

3.10 “through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms”

4.10 “He...ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.”

4.27 “do not give the devil a foothold”

5.11 “Have nothing to do with the fruitless deeds of darkness, but rather expose them.”

Now Paul closes his letter by joining these spiritual truths to the familiar image of the Roman soldier.

1. The Devil’s Schemes

a. Two Extreme Positions in the Church

1) Some think too little of the devil

2 Corinthians 2.11 “in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes”

2) Some think too much of the devil

1 Peter 5.8,9 “Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith”

b. Two Important Truths

1) The Devil is fighting Against God

Genesis 3.1 "Did God really say..."

Matthew 4.3 "If you are the Son of God..."

John 8.44 “the devil...He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks his native language, for he is a liar and the father of lies.”

2) The Devil is God’s Devil; as a creature of God:

a) He is Not Omniscient – Only God knows all Things

Mark 5.7 "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God?"

b) He is Not Omnipotent – Only God has all Power

Revelation 20.2 “He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan, and bound him for a thousand years.”

c) He is Not Omnipresent – he can only be in 1 place at 1 time

Mark 5.13 “the evil spirits came out and went into”

2. Our Struggle

a. Not against People

v. 12 “our struggle is not against flesh and blood”

2 Timothy 2.24-26 “the Lord's servant must not quarrel... Those who oppose him he must gently instruct... that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of *the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.*”

2 Corinthians 3.14 “their minds were made dull, for to this day the same veil remains when the old covenant is read. It has not been removed, because only in Christ is it taken away.”

2 Corinthians 4.4 “The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.”

b. Against Powers of Evil

v. 12 “our struggle is... against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms”

2 Corinthians 10.4,5 “The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.”

Mark 9.20-26 “When the spirit saw Jesus, it immediately threw the boy into a convulsion. He fell to the ground and rolled around, foaming at the mouth... Jesus... rebuked the evil spirit. “You deaf and mute spirit,” he said, “I command you, come out of him and never enter him again.” The spirit shrieked, convulsed him violently and came out.”

Matthew 12.28 “if I drive out demons by the Spirit of God, then the kingdom of God has come upon you”

3. Our Stand in the Lord

a. Strong in the Lord

v. 10 “be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power”

Zechariah 4.6 “Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,” says the LORD Almighty.”

1 Samuel 17.47 “for the battle is the LORD's”

Revelation 19.11-16 "I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. He treads the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God Almighty. On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS."

b. Stand your Ground

v. 13 "put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand"

2 Corinthians 12.7-9 "there was given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Philippians 4.13 "I can do everything through him who gives me strength."

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Ephesians 6.13-17

"Our Lord's Armor"

1. The Lord our Strength

a. Sovereignly Guides His Servants

3.1 "I, Paul, the prisoner of Christ Jesus"

4.1 "as a prisoner for the Lord"

b. Wears His own Armor

Isaiah 59.16,17 "His own arm worked salvation for him, and his own righteousness sustained him. He put on *righteousness as his breastplate*, and the *helmet of salvation on his head*; he put on the *garments of vengeance* and wrapped himself in *zeal as in a cloak*."

Isaiah 11.4,5 "He will strike the earth with the *rod of his mouth*; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. *Righteousness will be his belt* and *faithfulness the sash* around his waist."

Revelation 19.15 "Out of his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations. "He will rule them with an iron scepter."

b. Armor is a Picture of Jesus

1) Truth (4.21, John 14.6, 2 John 3)

2) Righteousness (1 Corinthians 1.30, Philippians 1.11)

- 3) Peace (Isaiah 9.6, Acts 10.36, Romans 5.1)
- 4) Faith (Acts 3.16, Romans 3.26, Hebrews 12.2)
- 5) Salvation (Matthew 1.21, 1 Thess 5.9, 2 Timothy 2.10)
- 6) Word of God (John 1.1,14, Revelation 19.13)

2. Wearing the Armor

a. Belt: Held Together by Truth

v. 14 “the belt of truth buckled around your waist”

1) Knowing the Truth of Scripture

v. 17 “the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God”

1.13 “the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation”

2) Showing the Truth of Scripture

v. 14 “Stand firm then, with the belt of truth”

4.15 “speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ”

1 John 1.6 “If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth.”

b. Breastplate: Protected by Righteousness

v. 14 “with the breastplate of righteousness in place”

Job 29.14 “I put on righteousness as my clothing; justice was my robe and my turban.”

Philippians 3.8,9 “that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ--the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith”

1) Imputed Righteousness: What Christ did For Us

Romans 3.21,22 “now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe.”

Romans 4.3-5 “Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.” Now when a man works, his wages are not credited to him as a gift, but as an obligation. However, to the man who does not work but trusts God who justifies the wicked, his faith is credited as righteousness.”

2) Imparted Righteousness: What Christ does In Us

4.24 “put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness”

Romans 6.13 “offer the parts of your body to him as instruments of righteousness”

c. Footgear: Marching out to Preach God’s Peace

v. 15 “with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace”

1) Mobility

2 Timothy 4.2 “Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season”

1 Peter 3.15 “Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have”

2) Peace

2.14-17 “He himself is our peace...He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near.”

Romans 5.1 “since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ”

3) Advancement

6.19 “Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel”

Romans 10.15 "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

Romans 16.20 “The God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet.”

d. Armor is from God: We must Put it On

Uniforms and equipment do not win battles, uniformed soldiers who rightly use their equipment do.

v. 10 “be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power”

v. 11 “Put on the full armor of God”

Philippians 2.12,13 “continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose”

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Ephesians 6.13-17

“Our Lord’s Armor – part 2”

Paul describes six pieces of armor; 5 defensive, 1 offensive

1. The Armor

Thus far we have considered:

- a. Belt: Hold Together by Truth
- b. Breastplate: Protected by Righteousness
- c. Footgear: Marching out to Preach God's Peace

d. Shield: Faith which deflects Evil

Roman Soldier's Shield – four feet by two feet, wood covered with leather that was soaked in water to extinguish flaming arrows.

v. 16 “take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one”

1) Primary – the first point of contact with the enemy

Hebrews 11.1,6 “Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see....And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.”

2) Definition

a.) Faith is NOT – Denial of the Intellect

Understanding Paul's Letters requires thinking:

1.18 “I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you”

3.4 “In reading this, then, you will be able to understand”

4.13,14 “become mature...no longer... blown here and there by every wind of teaching”

4.23 “be made new in the attitude of your minds”

5.10 “find out what pleases the Lord”

5.17 “understand what the Lord's will is”

5.32 “This is a profound mystery”

6.19 “words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel”

2 Timothy 2.7 “Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.”

2 Peter 3.15,16 “our dear brother Paul...His letters contain some things that are hard to understand”

b) Faith is NOT – claiming or visualizing our will

d) Faith’s Object is Jesus Christ

1.3 “every spiritual blessing in Christ”

1.6 “his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves”

1.10 “to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ”

1.15 “your faith in the Lord Jesus”

3.6 “the promise in Christ Jesus”

4.13 “unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God”

e) Faith’s Experience is Corporate

Shield edges were grooved to interlock with the soldiers on each side; Roman Army moved as Phalanx

6.18,19 “always keep on praying for all the saints. Pray also for me”

4.13 “until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature”

2.19 “fellow citizens with God’s people and members of God’s household”

e. Helmet: Thinking of Salvation

v. 17 “Take the helmet of salvation”

Psalm 140.7 “O Sovereign LORD, my strong deliverer, who shields my head in the day of battle”

1 Thessalonians 5.8 “the hope of salvation as a helmet”

1) Danger of Wrong Thinking

2.3 “All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our sinful nature and following its desires and thoughts.”

4.17,18 “Gentiles... the futility of their thinking...darkened in their understanding...the ignorance that is in them”

2 Corinthians 10.5 “We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.”

2) Importance of Right Thinking

5.17 “do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is”

6.7-9 “Serve wholeheartedly...*because you know* that the Lord will reward everyone...*since you know* that he who is both their Master and yours is in heaven”

Matthew 22.37 "Love the Lord your God with all your... mind.”

Acts 19.8-10 In Ephesus: “Paul entered the synagogue and spoke boldly there for three months, arguing persuasively about the kingdom of God...he had discussions daily in the lecture hall of Tyrannus. This went on for two years, so that all the Jews and Greeks who lived in the province of Asia heard

the word of the Lord.”

f. Sword: Conquering Power of Word of God

v. 17 “Take... the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God”

Acts 2.37 “When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart”

Hosea 6.5 “I cut you in pieces with my prophets, I killed you with the words of my mouth”

1) Belt and Sword: Truth Within and Without

Belt of Truth: Truthful Character, Integrity, Lifestyle

Sword of Truth: Truth in Ministry, Right Teaching

1 Timothy 1.5 “The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.”

1 Timothy 4.16 “Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.”

Titus 1.1 “the knowledge of the truth that leads to godliness”

2) Word and Spirit work Together

2 Peter 1.21 “men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit”

1 Corinthians 2.11 “no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God”

2 Timothy 3.16 “All Scripture is God-breathed”

John 6.63 “The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.”

3) Sword demands Wise and Careful Use

2 Timothy 2.15 “Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.”

Hebrews 4.12 “For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.”

1 Timothy 1.6,7 “Some have wandered away from these and turned to meaningless talk. They want to be teachers of the law, but they do not know what they are talking about or what they so confidently affirm.”

2. Applying the Armor

a. Necessary for All Believers

1.1, 6.11 “To the saints in Ephesus... Put on the full armor of God”

1 Peter 5.8,9 “Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith”

Matthew 26.41 “Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation.”

b. God Works In and Through Us

v. 10 “be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power”

v. 11 “Put on the full armor of God”

Philippians 2.12,13 “continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act according to his good purpose”

c. Nothing for our Backside

v. 13,14 “you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then”

v. 24 “Grace to all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with an undying love.”

John 12.31 “Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out.”

John 16.33 “I have overcome the world.”

d. Sufficient Protection

v. 10 “be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power”

v. 11 “so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes”

v. 13 “you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand”

v. 16 “you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one”

Psalm 91.1-7 “He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, “He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.” Surely he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence. He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday. A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you.”

"Our Mighty Weapon"

(Luke 4.1-13)

Three Weapons Satan often uses:

- 1) Active > Sin - some act of outright rebellion against God
- 2) Passive > Anxiety – Accuser raises doubt, fear, questions
- 3) Dormant > Strongholds – Hopelessness we accept as Unchangeable; i.e. “my life will never change...my church...my marriage...my child...my job...my city...”

Matthew 24.12,13 “Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold, but he who stands firm to the end will be saved.”

Against these three tactics we are given five defensive weapons:

- 1) Belt of Truth vs. Satan the Liar
- 2) Breastplate of Righteousness vs. Satan the Accuser
- 3) Sandals for the Gospel of Peace vs. Satan the Serpent
- 4) Shield of Faith vs. Satan the Tempter
- 5) Helmet of Salvation vs. Satan's Condemnation

One Offensive Weapon:

6.17 “Take...the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God”

Let us see this sword wielded by our Commander in Chief:

Luke 4.1-13 “Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert....”

Hebrews 5.8,9 “Although he was a son, he learned obedience from what he suffered and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him”

1. The Attacks of Satan Against Jesus

a. on His Person

Luke 4.3 "IF you are the Son of God"

Luke 4.2 “for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry”

Mark 1.13 “he was in the desert forty days, being tempted by Satan. He was with the wild animals”

Luke 3.22 “the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Hebrews 1.3-6 “The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father"? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, "Let all God's angels worship him."

Hebrews 2.17,18 “For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.”

Temptation Reveals Jesus in all Three of His Offices:

Prophet: Speaks the Word of God with power

Priest: Suffers on behalf of His people

King: Stands against Satan’s attack and sends him running

b. on His Purpose

Luke 4.5-7 “The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. So if you worship me, it will all be yours."

1 John 3.8 “The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work.”

Genesis 3.15 God to Serpent: “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel.”

John 12.31-33 “Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. But I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.”

c. on His Purity

Luke 4.8 Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"

Philippians 2.6,7 “Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.”

Exodus 20.3 "You shall have no other gods before me.

Exodus 20.4 “You shall not make for yourself an idol in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God”

Exodus 20.7 "You shall not misuse the name of the LORD your God, for the LORD will not hold anyone guiltless who misuses his name.”

Exodus 20.8 "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

Hebrews 10.5,7 “Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me;...Then I said, 'Here I am--it is written about me in the scroll-- I have come to do your will, O God.'"

A Lifelong Battle:

Luke 4.13 “When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time.”

2. The Attack Successfully Repelled

a. Word of God

v. 4 Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone.'"

Isaiah 11.2,4,5 “The Spirit of the LORD will rest on him-- the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of power...He will strike the earth with the rod of his

mouth; with the breath of his lips he will slay the wicked. Righteousness will be his belt and faithfulness the sash around his waist.”

John 1.1,14 “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God...The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

Revelation 19.11-13,15 “I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. With justice he judges and makes war. His eyes are like blazing fire, and on his head are many crowns. He has a name written on him that no one knows but he himself. He is dressed in a robe dipped in blood, and his name is the Word of God... Out of his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations.”

b. Specifically Applied

Two Greek words for 'word'

'Logos' = embraces everything - all the Scripture

'Rhema' = word with less weight, "a saying," particular verse

Ephesians 6.17 Paul uses 'Rhema'

Word used for sword in Ephesians 6.17: Roman Soldier's short sword, used in close encounter fighting

Application: Jesus' example and Paul's instruction teaches believers to have an exact and appropriate Word of Scripture to use in our struggle.

Luke 4.4 "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone.'"

Luke 4.8 "It is written: Worship the Lord your God and serve him only"

Luke 4.12 "It says: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

1 Timothy 3.16,17 “All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work”

c. Rightly Interpreted

Luke 4.9-11 “The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from here. For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.'"

2 Peter 3.16 “ignorant and unstable people distort (Paul’s letters) as they do the other Scriptures, to their own destruction”

Luke 4.12 Jesus answered, "It says: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

2 Timothy 2.15 “Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.”

3. The Advantages of God's Sword

a. Compelling

Luke 4.22 “All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his lips.”

Luke 24.32 “They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

Acts 2.5-11 “there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven.... Utterly amazed...we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!"

b. Convicting

4.21 “Surely you heard of him” (lit. ‘you heard him’)

John 16.8 “When he comes, he will convict the world of guilt in regard to sin and righteousness and judgment”

Acts 2.37 “When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

8. Am I actively doing all I can to maintain the unity of the Church in general, and my home church in particular?
9. What specific changes must I now put into place because God has spoken to me through the book of Ephesians; in my walk with God, in my family, in my work, in all my contacts with unbelievers, and my church involvement?
10. When will I implement the changes I need to make? Who will I ask to hold me accountable in my efforts?

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
