Papa LABAN - Deceitful Dad - held TIGHT Grip on FAMILY & FORTUNE
At least Several HUNDRED Homeboys Packing HEAT
HONOR Spurned, PRIDE Wounded, Betrayed by FAMILY, Finances Looted
Along with ANGRY Bros in Law THINK they've been ROBBED TOO!

v. 25 And Laban overtook Jacob. Now Jacob had pitched his tent in the hill country, and Laban with his kinsmen pitched tents in the hill country of Gilead. Arrive at NIGHT – Camp NEAR the Jacob CARAVAN – Know they're Caught Word > "pitching tent" – Not Normal Hebrew word for Simple Act POUNDING / THRUSTING Object INTO Something: HOSTILE Night Sound ANGRY Men – Slamming things Around – Seething Rage wait Morning Sun

# b. Dream

v. 24 But God came to Laban the Aramean in a dream by night and said to him, "Be careful not to say anything to Jacob, either good or bad."

God of COVENANT Defends his WAYWARD Sons - Dreams to AVENGERS

Abraham said of Sarah his wife, "She is my sister." And Abimelech king of Gerar sent and took Sarah. But God came to Abimelech in a dream by night and said to him, "Behold, you are a dead man because of the woman whom you have taken, for she is a man's wife..." Genesis 20.2,3

CAPTIVES? - LABAN been Prison Warden for Jacob's 20 yr Captivity!

ONLY NOW has their Family found FREEDOM FROM Lying Laban

NOTICE Daughters NOT Run & Embrace him, "Daddy, you SAVED Us!!"

v. 27 Why did you flee secretly and trick me, and did not tell me, so that I might have sent you away with mirth and songs, with tambourine and lyre?NEWS CAMERAS were there RECORD the SNICKERS and Shocked LooksLABAN? a Party for Them! Lives in State Legalized Marijuana: Been Smokin!

v. 28 And why did you not permit me to kiss my sons and my daughters farewell? Now you have done foolishly.

# 2. Confrontation – Rising into Action

a. deities

v. 19 Rachel stole her father's household gods – Little Detail of their Departure Jacob is NOT TOLD of her THEFT / We're NOT Told WHY she TOOK them Some Comm: CRITICAL – At Heart Beautiful Rachel IDOLATRESS, maybe?? Some: PREVENT Laban from CONSULTING them to FIND their Flight PLAN

In the presence of our kinsmen point out what I have that is yours, and take it." Now Jacob did not know that Rachel had stolen them.

WEB of Lies that held Jacob's Family together almost Brought Death to Rachel!

Jacob uses MASCULINE Tense, thinking one of his MEN took the gods

Character Weakness of HOLY FAMILY - telling too many LIES

Jacob & Mother Rebekah steal blessing from ISAAC with Lies

God of Jacob PROTECTED Favorite Wife of Patriarch – with More Lies!

"Here twenty years of angry frustration burst out in a diatribe of ferocious intensity." G. Wenham

vs. 38-42 These twenty years I have been with you. Your ewes and your female goats have not miscarried, and I have not eaten the rams of your flocks. What was torn by wild beasts I did not bring to you. I bore the loss of it myself. From my hand you required it, whether stolen by day or stolen by night. There I was: by day the heat consumed me, and the cold by night, and my sleep fled from my eyes. These twenty years I have been in your house. v. 53 The God of Abraham and the God of Nahor, the God of their father, judge between us." So Jacob swore by the Fear of his father Isaac

Jacob does not PLAY POLITICALLY Correct game of PLURALISM OLD LABAN can believe in gods of his Grandpa, Jacob swears to LIVING God JACOB only takes OATH for ONE God – Abe & Fear of ISAAC Perhaps this God was not yet fully the God of Jacob. Jacob's experience was not yet complete. But he at least recognized him as the God who has intervened in history in a real way. Iain Duguid

One VS. Shows how BADLY we Understand & Interpret Word of God!

Mizpah "Benediction"?? - Church Services or Weddings?? Esp in KJV

Here in Genesis they express suspicion. Laban does not trust Jacob, and Jacob does not trust Laban. They both regret that they will have no means to keep an eye on one another and prevent mischief-making, so they commend one another to the watchful eye of deity. John Walton

So Jacob swore by the Fear of his father Isaac, <sup>54</sup> and Jacob offered a sacrifice in the hill country and called his kinsmen to eat bread. They ate bread and spent the night in the hill country. <sup>55</sup>Early in the morning Laban arose and kissed his grandchildren and his daughters and blessed them. Then Laban departed and returned home.
